Interview

An Educationist, Author, Mentor, Motivator, Orator.....

Our interview started with her statement, "I believe in leading by example." It is a statement from a post-graduate in Economics from the University of Delhi, a premier institute for Economics. She is an educationist, author, mentor, motivator, orator, and a TEDx speaker. She is easily identifiable among the teaching fraternity and avid readers. Let us dwell on what Mrs. Mantri Kalyani Patnaik has in her genie.

Madam, please say about your career.

My father was the first IRAS (Indian Railway Accounts Service) in our community. Our family profile made me to focus on education and excellency. I did my Master's in Education and chose to excel in teaching. I have been teaching Pan India on different boards and different genres of schools. Currently, I am working as Principal and Head of School in Hiranandani Foundation School, Mumbai. I wrote articles on education-related matters that were published in books and magazines. I am on the advisory board of an NGO fostering education and social upliftment. My journey of 4 decades in the field of education has been enriching and impactful on leadership, mentoring, and motivating teachers.

My other qualifications include 1) Qualified in NABET Assessors course by Quality Control of India. 2) Qualified IB (International Baccalaureate) Administrator. 3) Qualified IB Examiner. 4) Leadership training at IIM Kolkata 5) Certified for School Counselling & Guidance.

Spearheaded and started several initiatives, of which my favourite is the Creative Writing and Reading Clubs. The favourites are the TEDx and the HFS MUN, which are held exclusively and are held in different classes every year. HFSMUN strives to maintain its original goal of nurturing awareness about international issues among young students and developing responsible future leaders who can participate in solving social, political, humanitarian, and economic crises across the world.

Being the daughter of an Indian Civil Servant and the spouse of a Fauji (Colonel), I moved across India and finally settled in Mumbai. I also visited all continents and could bring in the best practices in teaching and culture.

We understand that you have authored books. Can you tell us about them?

I wrote a book, "The Path to Leadership" that makes one discover one's inner strength. I shared my observations & learnings acquired my stellar teaching career. I also authored another book, "Knowledge Trails" meant for 8-12 years age group. 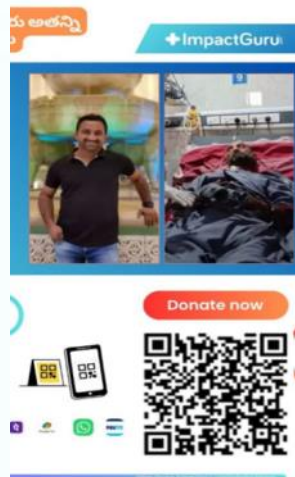
Urgent Appeal for Medical Support

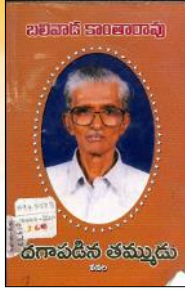

they face inevitable punishment. The endless tragic tale of this couple grips the reader with compassion and sorrow.

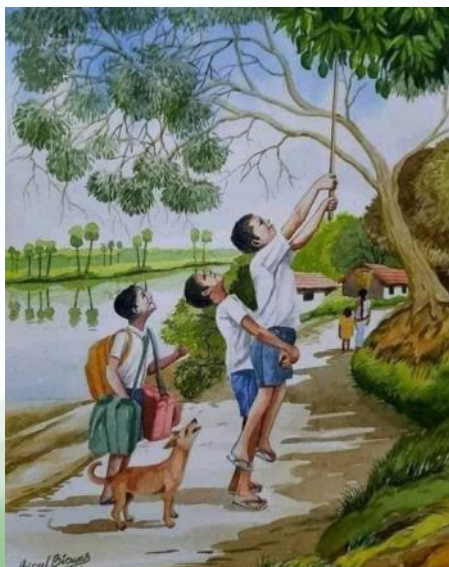

September 29 - 2025 - On the occasion of World Heart Day..

The heart is the lifeblood of the human body from the moment we inhale to the moment we exhale. That is, the heart continues to work continuously without stopping. We should take care of and protect this very important heart. To remind us of this and to create awareness about taking more precautions, the World Health Federation, an affiliate of WHO, has been organizing World Heart Day on September 29 every year since 2000. In our busy daily routine, we may not pay much attention to this issue. As a result, the heart may be at risk and diseases may occur. Deaths may occur. It is estimated that two crore people die worldwide every year due to this. The alarming factor is that 40 percent of these people are between the ages of 60 and 70. 30 percent of people lack proper awareness about these heart diseases and do not take precautions. With the potential to reduce such deaths, the federation members are playing their part effectively in educating the public. They are working to create awareness among all age groups. Each year they are coming up with a different theme.

The theme for this 2025 is. "Don't miss a heartbeat". We should know about our heart. We should know how to use it to function properly. If such awareness programs are carried out, deaths can be reduced to some extent. People above 50 should be careful about heart care. People above 60 should be more careful. People above 70 should be even more careful.

These are the important precautions to take.

- 1) Do walking exercises like yoga for at least 30 minutes every day.
- 2) If there is no fatigue, climb and descend the stairs, at least 40 steps.
- 3) Get regular heart-related tests done as per the advice of the doctor. If necessary, take prescribed medicines.
- 4) Cholesterol and sugar levels should be kept under control.
- 5) Obesity should be avoided.
- 6) Do not succumb to stress due to emotions. Make sure that BP is not high.

7) Attention to diet is very important. Salt and sugar should be reduced. Food should be consumed in moderation and plenty of fresh water should be consumed.

8) Physical and mental peace is very important.

9) Good words, good ways and good behavior should be practiced.

10) One should have a positive attitude.

Finally, a message.

There are two eyes, legs, hands and kidneys. There is only one heart. There is only one thinking brain. If there is no one heart, there is no life. On the occasion of World Heart Day, let's share this post with all our friends. Let's raise awareness, stay healthy. Let's take steps towards raising awareness. Let's keep the heart healthy.

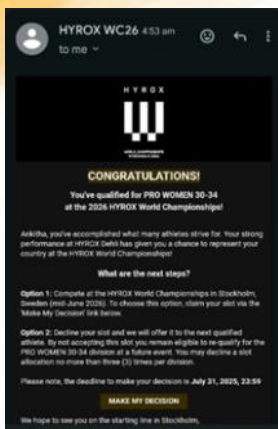
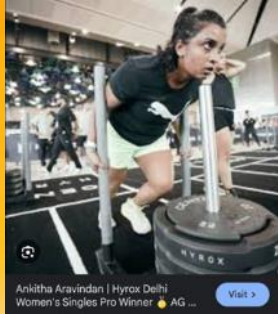

The mantra "ManiPadmeHum" a highly chanted mantra by budhists of all walks of life, is a simple yet a powerful mantra.

It means Jewel in the Lotus. It signifies the goal of spiritual growth in many ways. As one grows spiritually he needs to be as soft as lotus for others, yet he is internally as strong as the diamond.

One needs to eliminate all the fears, and apprehensions, and whimsical reactions. Yet however strong he becomes, he is softspoken and gentle to others. Such is the character of wise masters.

Also lotus is known to be pure, irrespective of the mud and filth it grows from. Such is the outlook of wise masters. Irrespective of the world around them, they maintain the pure and divine exhibits to the world.

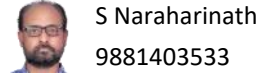

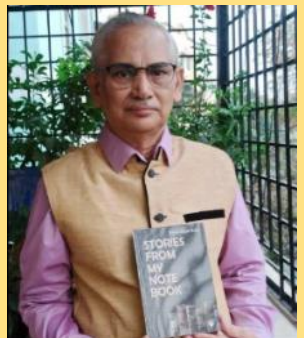
We have another WhatsApp Group called SAHITYAM-KALALU-

Stories from my Note Book, 124 pages, was authored by Sri Wuriti Chanti Babu of Hyderabad. Sri Chanti Babu belongs to



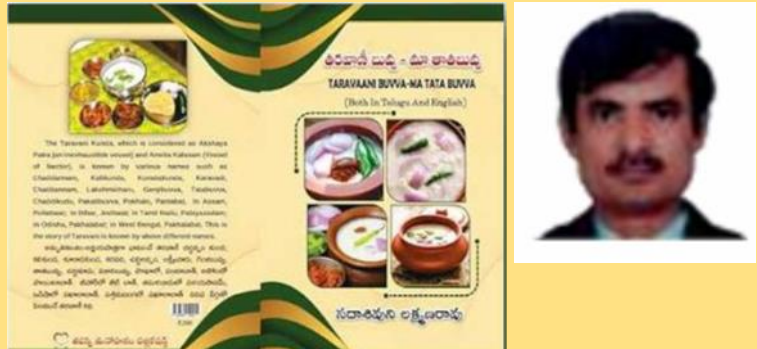

ried to Smt Saradamma in 1945. His daughter Smt Lakshmi Kumari was married to Sri Ganesh Patro, a well known Cite Writer

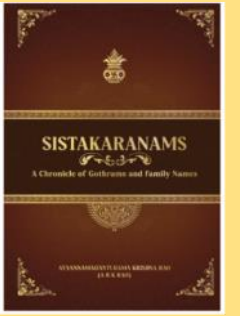

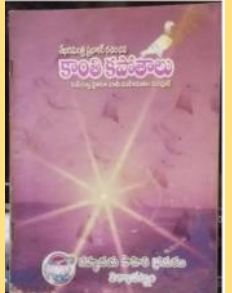
11. KANTHI KAPOTHALU and other books by Sri Sekharamahanthi Prabhakar, Visakhapatnam

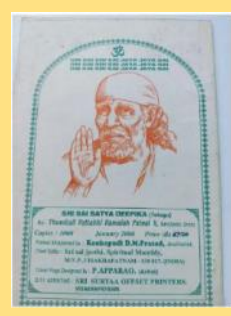
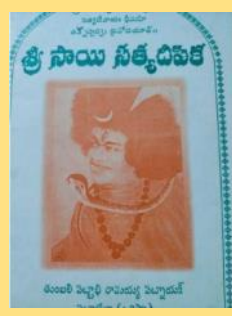

It is pertinent here to remember some of our stalwarts in Sistakaranams who left their foot prints in the Telugu literary world, particularly in All India Radio programs, Television Serials, Film industry and Stage dramas at State and National levels. To name at least three such wizards are 1. Sri Adivishnu Vighneswara Rao 2. Sri Ganesh Patro and 3. Sri Balivada Kantha Rao whose brief profiles are given below.

Sri Adivishnu Vighneswara Rao was born on September 16, 1939 in Machilipatnam, Krishna District, Andhra Pradesh. His parents are Nagaiah Adivishnu and Smt Lakshmi Narsamma. He worked in the AP State Road Transport Corporation (APSRTC), Hyderabad as a Chief Public Relations Manager. He started writing plays, stories and novels right during his college student days in 1959 which he extended to the Telugu Cinema industry over his long career in 40 films. His contribution in the movie AHA NAA PEL-LANTA (Comedy) is well remembered. He also worked in USHA KIRAN MOVIES, Story Division for two years.



While in College, he acted in a play ANANTHAM and won Best Actor award. His short stories were published in magazines like BHARATHI, JYOTHI, ANDHRA PATRIKA, etc. He was associated with popular artistes like Singaraju Ramachandra Murthy and Kuppili Venkateswara Rao, who worked for Social Drama. He was well known as ADIVISHNU, his pen name. He wrote Tragedies and Comedy and one such play to remember is MANCHU THERA. He died on January 6, 2020 in Hyderabad. Sri Behara Ganesh Patro (22 June 1945 – 5 January 2015) was an Indian playwright and screen writer known for his works in Telugu Cinema. He was born in **Parvathipuram of Vizianagaram District, Andhra Pradesh**. He started his career in 1965, and wrote dialogues, songs and stories for Telugu films from 1970s upto the 1990s including Rudraveena, Maro Charitra, Idi Katha Kaadu, Mayuri and Seetharamayya Gari Manavaralu.



He worked in over 100 films and is known for his association with

famous personalities like K Balachander and Kodi Ramakrishna. Other movies worth remembering are Maa Pallelo Goopalu-du, Nirnayam and Mayuri. After about 15 years of sabbatical, he wrote dialogues for Seethamma Vaakitlo Sirimalle Chettu in 2013. Sri Patro also wrote many plays in Telugu theatre and literature. He died at the age of 69 in Chennai, Tamil Nadu while undergoing a treatment for cancer. He received Nandi Award twice for Best Dialogue Writing for Telugu films. [Ganesh Patro - Wikipedia.](#)

Sri Balivada Kanta Rao (3 July 1927 – 6th May 2000) was a noted Telugu novelist and playwright. He was born in Madapam village in Srikakulam District of Andhra Pradesh. He worked in various capacities as Civilian Officer in the Indian Navy. He has to his credit 38 major and minor novels, 400 short stories, 5 major plays, host of playlets and radio plays and travelogues. Many of his novels and stories have been translated into other Indian languages. He won several awards which include Andhra Pradesh Sahitya Akademy, Telugu University Award, Gopichand Literary Award, Ravi Shastri Memorial Award and Kalasagar Vishishta Puraskaram.
