Structure of Associations - Scope - Management

To the President Secretary and Executive Committee Members of the State, District and Regional Sistakaranam Associations,

Heartiest Greetings.

For your understanding, I am articulating the ideal structure and implementation of our associations.

Regional (mandal or branch) associations are the real Sistakaranam associations, in which our relatives and family members are directly members, about 50 to 300, have an independent executive committee, and they directly observe the hardships and pleasures of their relatives and work for their welfare.

These societies issue caste certificates and other identity documents to the members of the associations.

Such associations come together as a federation across the district and form district societies, then through district associations across the state, state associations and through them, the All-India Association.

All associations from regional associations to the All-India Association have independent executive committees and work within their scope and provide assistance and cooperation.

However, district associations have no influence or superintendencies over regional associations. Neither do the state associations have any influence over the district associations, nor does the

All India Association have any influence over the state associations. Most importantly, they have complete independence in the conduct of elections to their respective associations.

The district association have no right to interfere in the conduct of elections to any branch association, similarly state associations with district associations, or the All India Association with the state associations. Their responsibility is limited to merely offering advice and acting as intermediaries if requested.

Otherwise, if elections are held with those who are dissatisfied, dissident, or under the influence of selfish interests, it will be a separatist association, but not a real association.

The reason, if we remember once again, is that the regional (mandal/branch) associations are the real treasury of the people. The remaining district, state and All India associations are only their federal forms.

It is requested that every association should be aware of these matters and should conduct their own executive elections as independent associations on time, organize executive meetings, cooperate and work for the welfare of the families of the social class.

A Few Disclaimers

Interview

National Teacher, Writer, Singer

A social subject teacher who won national best teacher award from the President of India has another shade as a writer and singer. He won a prize in TANA's songs competition – Hum for nature. In his professional career, State identified him as District Resource Person for holistic development of schools. He got an award for the best four-line composition titled "Kallu" (Eyes) from the World Telugu Federation, Madras. He is left with three years of service to retire. Did you recollect who he is? He is Kudama Tirumala Rao, M.A., M.Ed. Let us talk to him about his success.

Please narrate achievements in your profession.

I began my teaching career in 1989. I received the Best Teacher Award at the district level in 10 years, 1999, state level in 16 years, and national level in 24 years of service.

I received the State-level Best Teacher Award from Hon'ble Chief Minister Sri Y.S. Rajasekhara Reddy. I received the National-level Best Teacher Award from the Hon'ble President, Smt. Pratibha Patil. Hon'ble Prime Minister, Sri Manmohan Singh hosting dinner at his office and spending three hours with us is something unforgettable in my life.

State your services to Sistakarana Community.

I serve as an executive committee member of the Rajam Regional Sistakarana Sangham and actively participate in the *Karthika Samaradhana* programs. Having joined as a life member, I have contributed to membership drives and efforts toward the development of the Sistakarana community building. My writings—specifically life stories and success stories—have been featured in *Sistakarana Lekha* and other compilations related to the community.

Narrate unforgettable incidents, if any.

Although I had limited myself to poetry and songs during the first ten years of my career, the Education Department entrusted me with the responsibilities of a District Resource Person. I evolved into a speaker capable of clearly articulating teaching techniques, activity-based learning strategies, and measures for the holistic development of schools—even to colleagues with more years of service than I had.

I was able to state it so clearly only because I personally strive to provide quality education to students in the classroom. For ten consecutive years, I actively participated in and successfully conducted at least fifty different types of training camps—serving as a State Resource Person, Key Resource Person, DRP, and 'Strong Teacher'—across the levels of the erstwhile united Andhra Pradesh state, Srikakulam district, Palakonda division, and

Veeraghattam mandal. State Project Director of Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan, sent me a letter from Hyderabad in 2003 specifically commending my work.

Any messages to our community?

We should encourage fellow members of the Sistakarana community. We should take pride in the progress of any member of our community. Talented individuals should be given greater support. We should conduct ourselves with a sense of social responsibility. As much as possible, we should dedicate time to staying informed about the well-being of our community members. My advice is to make good use of time and stay away from bad habits.

Free Sistakaranam Stores Group

A WhatsApp group named "Free Sishtakaranam Stores Group" has been launched. Its primary objective is to enable Sishtakaranam community members to give away any pre-owned items they no longer use—completely free of charge—to other community members who might need them.

These items could include mixers, grinders, chairs, divan cots, sofas, racks, books, beds, dining tables, and—importantly—equipment useful for patients that is expensive or hard to find in the market (such as walkers, room heaters, or massage equipment). If you have such items in good condition that you wish to donate to fellow community members, please inform the admin; they will post the details in the group.

Rules for group members:

1) If you have unused pre-owned items you wish to donate to the community, please share the details with the group admin. The admin will then post these details in the group. Your phone number will be shared only with the specific person who requests the item, and their number will be shared with you; this ensures there is no unnecessary disturbance for either party.

2) Please send a photo (just one) along with the details of the items you are offering. Community members who need the items will come to your home to collect them; you will not incur any transportation costs. Recipients must personally collect the items from the donor's residence at their own expense; under no circumstances should the donor deliver the items. Collection is not restricted to the same village; Sistakaranams from neighboring villages who are in need may also collect the items.

3) The name, address, and phone number of both the donor and the recipient must be provided to the Admin. A serial number will then be assigned. These details will be posted in the group for information purposes after the items have been collected.

4) Recipients must provide a photocopy of their Aadhaar card. Additionally, they must send a message confirming that the items are for personal use and expressing gratitude to the donor. Items should be taken only if the recipient genuinely likes them and is fully willing to accept them.

5) You may join this group if these terms are acceptable to you; however, every member who joins must provide their full name (including surname), village, and phone number.

6) This group was started purely with a spirit of service; no money needs to be paid to anyone. Let us run it smoothly, without formalities, and with the feeling that we are all one family.

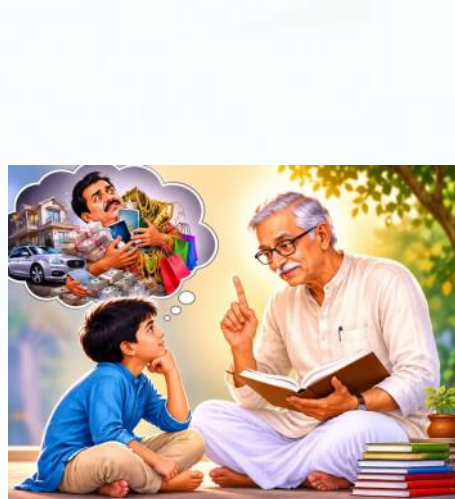

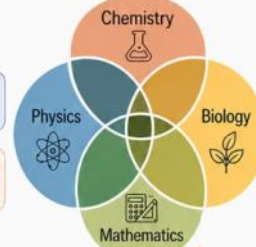

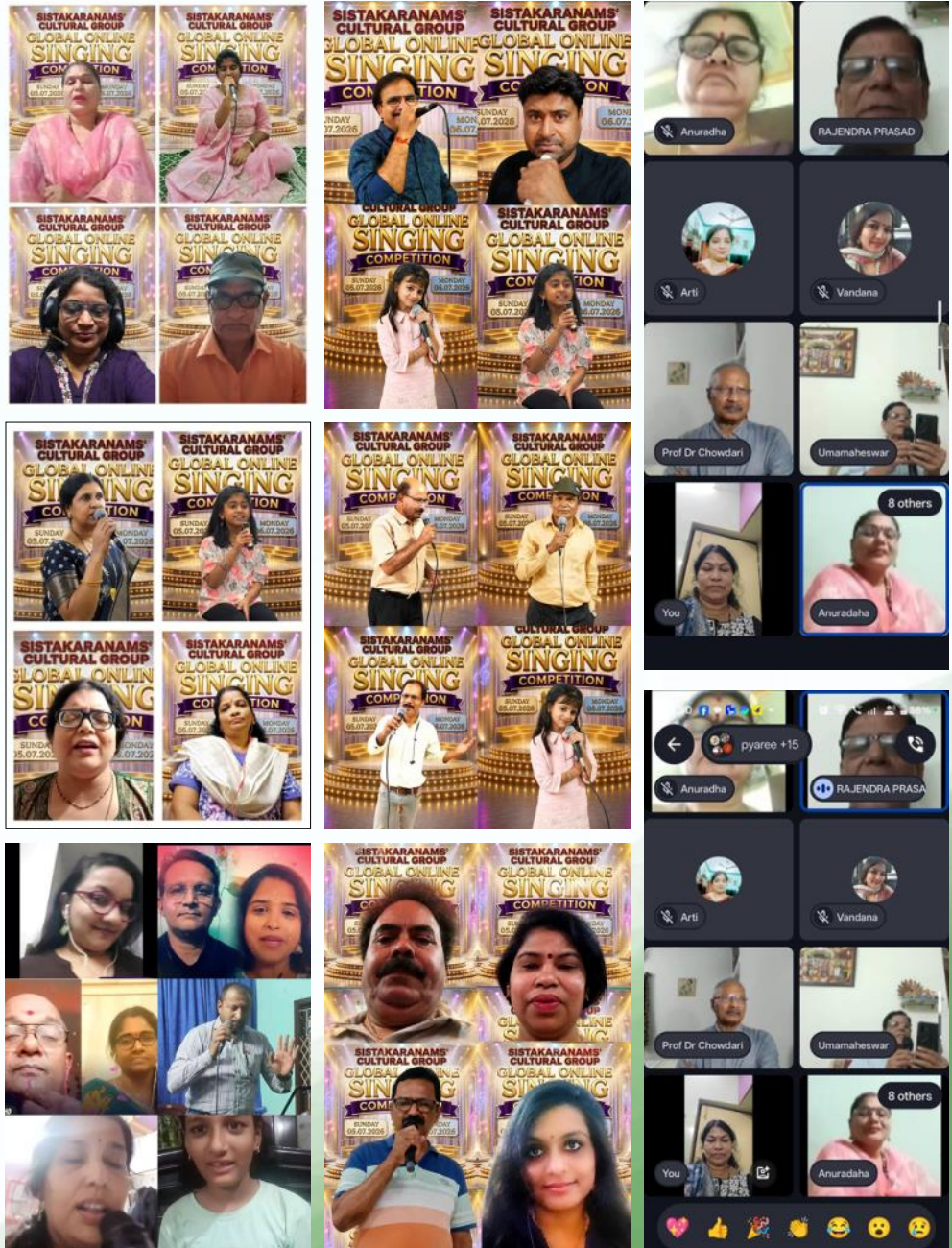
Grand online Songs Competition by Sistakaranams Cultural Talents Group

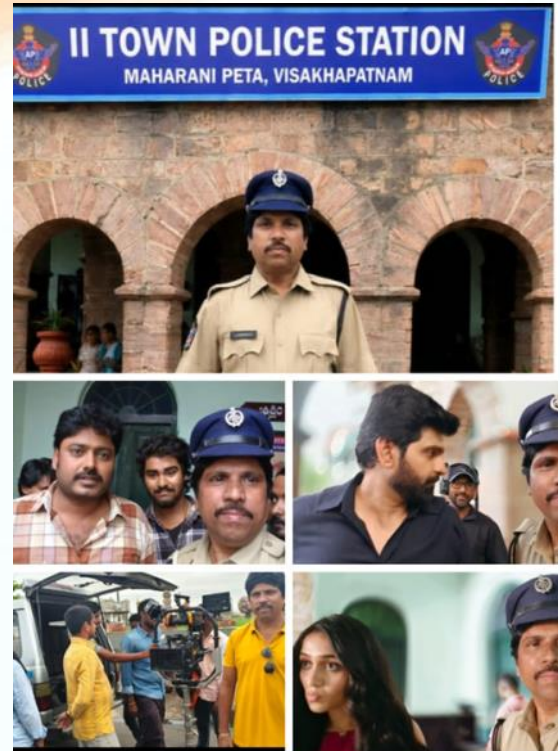

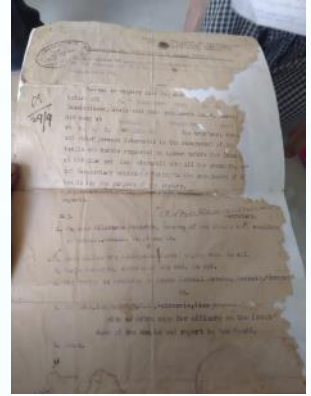

A Basic Understanding of Zoonotic Diseases is Essential - Dr. Kuppli Suresh Babu

On the occasion of World Zoonosis Day, Community Health Physician Dr. Kuppli Suresh Babu spoke about the precautions to be taken regarding animal-borne diseases, as outlined below.

Since the dawn of human existence, humans have relied on animals and birds for various needs - such as obtaining eggs, milk, meat, and hides. However, rearing these creatures requires both awareness and vigilance, as numerous diseases can be transmitted from animals and birds to humans. Examples include tuberculosis (TB), anthrax, plague, bird flu, swine flu, and brucellosis; Globally, five million people die annually from such zoonotic diseases (diseases transmitted from animals to humans).

Diseases transmitted from animals to humans are called zoonotic diseases. Every

July, veterinary experts organize awareness seminars on these zoonotic diseases to educate the public on proper animal husbandry, disease prevention, and necessary precautions, particularly given the risks associated with close human interaction with animals. These diseases can be caused by various pathogens, including bacteria, viruses, parasites, fungi, or mixed infections. World Zoonosis Day is observed annually on July 6th to commemorate the discovery of the rabies vaccine by Louis Pasteur in 1885. One should not raise pets without proper awareness regarding zoonotic diseases. Rabies is an extremely dangerous and fatal disease; dogs can transmit conditions like mange and rabies, while cats - specifically their fur - can cause severe allergies leading to symptoms such as runny nose, coughing, and breath-

lessness. Grazing animals like sheep and goats can transmit anthrax. Raising animals requires great caution, as veterinarians, farmers, and those in close contact with pets are at higher risk of contracting these diseases. In modern society, failing to take precautions regarding the health of pets poses a threat to our own lives. Key precautions include bathing pets every two or three days, ensuring they are vaccinated, avoiding sleeping with or kissing them, and washing hands thoroughly after touching them.

Dr. Kuppli Suresh Babu, a public health physician, has provided this information to raise awareness about responsible pet ownership as part of his service to the community.

Know Your Community and AISKA

(Part - 23)

Sistakaranams : BC / OBC – Perseverance and Patience-3

23.1 In Part 22, we touched upon the long journey of **OTHER BACKWARD CLASSES (OBCS)** in India beginning with 1. Four Varnas and numerous traditional Castes in various States, 2. Reservation System during British Government and in the Kingdoms of Mysore Maharaja and Maharashtrian Kings like Chatrapathi Shahu aka Rajarshi Shahu Maharaj of Kolhapur (1891), 3. Reservation for SC & STs in post independence era, 4. Census 1931 and thereafter, 5. Backward Classes Commission-1 headed by Sri Kaka Kalelkar (1953-1955), 6. Commission for BCs-2 headed by **Sri BP Mandal (1978-1980)**, 7. State BC Commissions eg., in AP during 1970s and thereafter, 8. Decision to implement **Mandal Commission Recommendations in 1990 by GOI** headed by then PM Sri VP Singh, 9. **Indra Sawhney Case on Creamy Layer** (1992), 10. Creation of GOI Ministry like Social Justice and Empowerment, 11. **National Commission for Backward Classes (NCBC, 1993)** 12. National Commission for Minorities, 13. The Central Educational Institutions (Reservations in Admissions) Act, 2006, 14. Justice Rohini Commission (2017-23), 15. Constitutional Amendments from time to time, 16. Powers to State Governments to decide on BCs, 17. Supreme Court Decision by Hon'ble Justice Nagaratna in March 2026 and 18. **Caste Surveys at State and Central levels**, etc. Such was the long, long story of the concept of OBCs in India. For better clarity of some of these concepts, please carry out Google search on the internet or refer to Wikipedia and YouTube Clippings on each of them.

23.2 In the context of the Indian reservation system, the **Most Backward Class (MBC)** is a sub-category of the broader **Other Backward Classes (OBCs)**. It refers to specific marginalized and socio-educationally disadvantaged castes that require more targeted affirmative action and developmental aid than other backward communities. Because the classification of backwardness is handled at both central and state levels, the interpretation of this term and the communities it includes vary significantly depending on regional demographics and socioeconomic histories. There also is another concept called **Economically Backward Class (EBC)** in States like Bihar. For comprehensive state-specific lists of castes under the MBC category, you can refer to the official [Tamil Nadu Backward Classes Welfare Department](#) or the national [National Commission for Backward Classes \(NCBC\)](#) portals

23.3 For better clarity and overall understanding, let us expand different **categories of Castes in India**. These are 1. Other Backward Classes (OBCs), 2. Economically Backward Class (EBC), 3. Most Backward Class (MBC), 4. Scheduled Castes (SC), 5. Scheduled Tribes (ST), 6. General Category (GEN), 7. Economically Weaker Section (EWS), 8. Unreserved Category (UR), 9. Open Category (OC), 10. Hearing Handicapped (HH), 11. Person With Disability (PWD), 12. Special Background Classes (SBC), 13. Nomadic Tribes (NT) and 14. Vimukt

Jaati (VJ). Disabled or Handicapped is alternatively called as Challenged.

23.4 We are aware that **AISKA was founded in 1925** with a primary aim of upliftment of poor and needy among our Sistakaranam community members. Educational facility to the needy and deserving poor / meritorious students and teachers was taken up to begin with. Reservation facility was available to these families even after independence, and in erstwhile Andhra Pradesh State until the year 1968. Due to **Anantharaman Commission Report**, our Caste was **excluded from the List of BCs vide GO Ms No. 1793 of 23-09-1970 of Govt of AP**. Immediately, both AISKA, Berhampore (Odisha Regn.No. 2/1947) and APSKA, Hyderabad (Regn No. 88/1965) took up with the State Govt of AP for restoration.

23.5 Subsequently, Senior Advocate **Sri P.S. Prakasa Rao, President of AISKA and Dr T Joga Rao, President of APSKA** (Regn No.63/1979) and many other subsequent leaders strived hard, agitated, approached various MLAs and MPs and submitted Affidavits to the Central Government. We succeeded in inclusion of our **Sistakaranam Caste in the List of BCs** as per Mandal Commission requirements vide **Sr.No.247 as a first step in the year 1980**. However, **Muralidhara Rao Commission in the year 1982**, declined to recommend our Caste in the List of BCs in Andhra Pradesh. Thereafter sincere efforts were going on by our leadership for inclusion both at State and Central Governments. A prolonged persuasion and struggle yielded us the **Status of BC-D in AP in February 2009**, which is continuing in the two Telugu States of Telangana (formed in 2014) and AP.

23.6 However, our demand for the status of **OBC at Central level** remains to be favoured for various internal and external reasons as also several administrative, political and legal developments at Central level (as listed in the para 23.1 above). Against several constraints, our AISKA and APSKA leaders continued to represent at various forums, by appearing in public hearings, organising garjanas (2008) / morchas / public meetings, pleading by Members of Parliament, Members of Legislative Assembly and representing to all the authorities concerned till date.

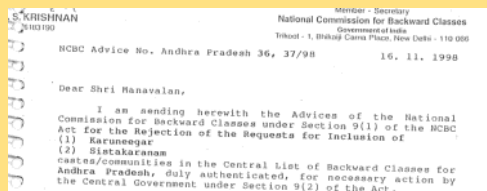
23.7 As is well known, in 1990s, Sistakaranam Caste was not in either Central or State BC Lists. APSKA led by late **Sri AV Jagannadha Rao, Sri NSV Prasada Rao and 4 others appeared before the NCBC for a public hearing on 5.5.1998 in Hyderabad** and furnished all data in support of our claim. After completion of all related steps, NCBC vide their **Advices No. 37/1998 dated November 16, 1998 rejected our request** to include in the List of BCs for reasons mentioned therein. Thereafter our focus was at State level by appearing before the two BC Commissions headed by Justice Puttuswamy in 2004 and Justice Davala Subramaniam in 2009. A long drawn strug-

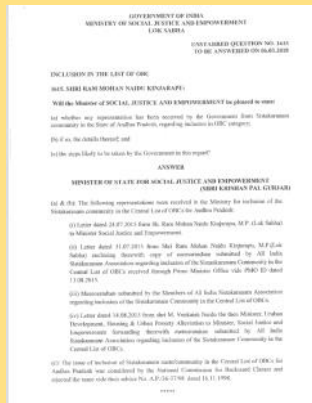

23.8 The Sistakaranam Community had to struggle for four decades between the years 1970 and 2009 only to get restored the gen-

uine grievance of losing the status of Backward Class. It is unfortunate that there have been several changes in policies of the Governments, the

Chief Ministers of AP State and Prime Minister / other Central Ministers, changes in leadership of our own Associations at State and All India level and many more developments adversely affecting our community. Our appeal for BC / OBC status in consonance with Mandal Commission recommendations was first turned down in the year 1998 by NCBC / GOI. Even after the AP Govt accorded us the status of BC-D in Feb 2009, again the Central Government (led by NDA / BJP), in March 2018 decided against us, based on the past information, although our appeal was made to the **Prime Minister in 2015** which was recommended by Sri Venkaiah Naidu, then Union Minister and Sri K Rammohan Naidu, MP of Srikakulam (TDP). Sri GVL Narasimha Rao MP (BJP), Dr K Lakshman MP (BJP and Chairman of OBC Morcha), Sri Bellana Chandrasekhar and Sri Pilli Subhashchandra Bose, MPs of YSRCP and other leaders have also been strongly pursuing the pending proposal.

INCLUSION OF BACKWARD CASTES IN CENTRAL OBC LIST IN ANDHRA PRADESH

The State Government of Andhra Pradesh has forwarded their recommendations for inclusion of Sistakaranam, Kalinga Vyasa, Sondi and Arava castes in the Central OBC List. Inclusion of new castes in the Central List of OBCs is done as per provisions of Article 342A of the Constitution.

This information was given by the Minister of State for Social Justice and Empowerment Sushri Pratima Bhoomik in a written reply to a question in Rajya Sabha today.

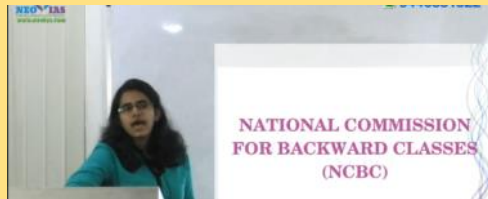

23.9 In spite of the adverse decision in March 2018, our leadership of **APSKA / TSSKA / SWA and AISKA did not give up**. Regular meetings were organised, data collected, grievances submitted to Peoples' Representatives, State and Central Ministers / Chief Ministers, Prime Minister, Minister for Social Justice & Welfare, Chairman NCBC and Chairmen of AP and Telangana State BC Commissions between 2018 and 2023. MPs of Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha from the two Telugu States belonging to **BJP, TDP and YSRCP parties** were approached to raise questions in the two Houses of Parliament, which they did. In 2023, the NCBC / GOI received formal letters of recommendations from the two Telugu States with a request to include Sistakaranam and other eligible communities in the List of OBC.

23.10 Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, GOI, in a Reply in Parliament (RS), issued a Press Notification through PIB, New Delhi on **December 6, 2023 that AP Government forwarded its recommendation to include Sistakaranams, Sondi, Kalinga Vy-sya and Arava communities** in the List of OBCs, as per Constitutional provision. It is reliably learnt that as many as 80 such Castes from all over India have appealed for such a facility and the Government is actively considering the same. Meantime, many developments are taking place in administration, political fields, Elections at various levels, while the community members of all above Castes are eagerly awaiting for a favourable decision. Needless to maintain that unfortunately there have been certain untoward developments are taking place at the level of leadership of Sistakaranam Associations at different levels, which presumably is weakening our bargaining capacity. Only time will decide the matters finally and hopefully the posterity will benefit the facility for their higher education, employment and other opportunities in their life, as soon as possible.

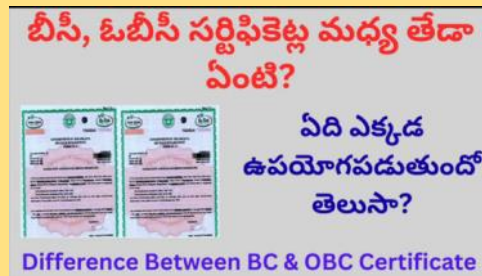
